## 2020 SOFAAR Members' Exhibition Call for Entry and Guidelines:

## SOFAAR Presents Our Architectural Heritage

All members of SOFAAR are invited to participate in the annual members' exhibition at the Chapel Gallery at ARTsPLACE in Annapolis Royal from June 14 to August 2, 2020.

The theme of this year's exhibition is *Our Architectural Heritage*. We're defining a heritage home or other architectural structure as one that is at least 100 years old, more or less.

We originally launched this exhibition with the theme of Heritage

Homes but we have expanded the parameters to include our wider

architectural heritage. In addition to houses members may also

consider old barns, churches, schools, RR stations, bridges, etc. as inspiration
for their entry.

You can use an image of a building from any time period, from when it was built until the present day. You may opt to create a realistic image of the home or use an abstract interpretation. You can present a view of the entire house or pick one feature (an interesting window or door, perhaps) or a collage of different features. Any fibre medium or combination is permissible, so you have lots of

#### Annual Exhibition Call for Entry - continued

Here are some things to keep in mind when you are preparing for the exhibition:

- You are invited to submit one or two pieces of your choice. Entries will not be juried.
- Each entry may not exceed 150" in perimeter. The Chapel Gallery is a small and intimate space.
- We ask that you include a full digital image of your work for each entry. This helps
  us plan the layout for the gallery before installation.
- Email your photos to <u>info@sofaar.ca</u> with the following information for each entry by the deadline for receipt of entries, Thursday, June 4, 2020.
  - Title of the piece
  - Size, height X width
  - Materials used
  - Is the piece for sale? If so, what is the price?
  - Please include an artist's statement with your submission. The statement is simply one or two sentences explaining what inspired you to create the piece.
  - Does SOFAAR have permission to use your photos to promote the exhibition?
- Each piece must be clearly labelled on the back with the artist's name and the title
  of the work.
- Work to be hung must be ready for hanging, including a hanging rod, if applicable, and any special hardware if a simple nail will not suffice. If your work requires a special display, please provide it.
- Work may be for sale but the piece must remain in the exhibition until the closing date. ARTsPLACE will handle all sales and will take a 25% fee.

- Although every care will be taken of the submitted work, the responsibility for loss and damage whilst in exhibition cannot be accepted by SOFAAR or ARCAC. We strongly advise that each artist obtain commercial insurance to cover their work on exhibit.
- We ask that you deliver your work to the ARTsPLACE, 396 St. George St., Annapolis Royal, Tuesday, June 9, from 10:00 12:00 and 1:00 4:00. If this is not possible, contact us at <a href="info@sofaar.ca">info@sofaar.ca</a> to make alternate arrangements.
- We ask that you collect your work at ARTsPLACE, August 4, 2020, from 10:00 12:00. If this is not possible, contact us at <a href="mailto:info@sofaar.ca">info@sofaar.ca</a> to make alternate arrangements.

## Support Our Local Fibre Producers

The 2<sup>nd</sup> annual 100 MILE FOOD & FIBRE FESTIVAL will be held on Saturday, September 12<sup>th</sup>, 2020 from 10 am until 4 pm at the Northville Farm Heritage Center. Rain date (significant rainfall) is Sunday, September 13<sup>th</sup>. This celebration of local foods and fibres is hosted by the Annapolis Valley Farmland Trust, Northville Farm Heritage Centre and Kings County Federation of Agriculture and will serve as a fund raiser and to promote awareness for these organizations.

The Northville Farm Heritage Center is located just north of Centreville on the corner of Steadman and Thorpe Roads in a thriving rural agricultural area. The center is a living museum which features traditional farm machinery and tools and presents agricultural events throughout the year such as horse ploughing, ox pulls, scythe competitions and more.

In addition to a large array of food, drink and fibre artisan vendors on site, plans for the 100 MILE FOOD & FIBRE FESTIVAL include live music, free hayrides, sheep dog competition, sheep shearing demonstrations, free hay rides, weavers, hookers, spinners, felters and knitters interacting with visitors and a variety of fibre animals on site for viewing.

Fibre Artisan Vendors are being sought to take part in this event. Such vendors may offer for sale items that are created entirely from natural sources such as sheep, alpaca, llama or flax fibres. As this event is a celebration of local products, items for sale should be created using as much locally sourced fibres as possible. "Local" implies that fibres used come from farms within the Maritimes. 
## Inspiration for Winter Days
